### **La Plata Electric Association board officers announced** ***Michael Rendon re-elected board president for 2015-2016***

DURANGO, Colo. – Today (Wednesday, May 20, 2015), during its regularly scheduled Board of Directors meeting, La Plata Electric Association (LPEA) board members re-elected Michael Rendon (District 3) by acclamation to serve as 2015-2016 president.

Tom Compton (District 2) was elected as vice president, with Jeff Berman (District 3) retaining his office as secretary and newly-elected director Karen Barger (District 4) elected as treasurer by acclamation. Collectively, the four make up the board's Executive Committee.

Joe Wheeling (District 4) will maintain his seat on the Tri-State Generation and Transmission Association board, and Berman and Bob Formwalt (District 1) will continue as the delegates for the Colorado Rural Electric Association (CREA) and Western United boards, respectively.
