








Scope of LPEA's Service Territory*





Financials

- Met or exceeded all financial key performance indicators:
 - Cash reserves: 12–20% (within target range)
 - Operating margin: 3.1% (above 2.5% target)
 - Equity percentage: 54% (target range: 40–55%)
 - Long-term debt: 62% of equity (well below the 100% limit)
 - Modified Debt Service Coverage (MDSC): 2.48 (well above the 1.35 requirement)
- Returned \$1.5 million in capital credits to members who received service in 2003 and 2023.

Top-Tier Safety Performance

- Zero lost-time incidents in 2024 meeting LPEA's top safety goal
- Awarded Diamond Level Safety Award by APPA the highest safety honor

Exceptional Reliability

- Just 38 major outages lowest since 2018
- 0.9 outages/member vs. 1.4 national average
- Outages averaged 82.9 minutes far shorter than the 335.5minute national and 150-minute Colorado averages

- 23 miles of line replaced
- 119 rejected poles & 85 broken crossarms replaced
- 73 raptor protection devices installed




