### **BECAUSE OF YOUR GENEROSITY**

In 2022, the Round Up Foundation funded 30 Round Up grants for non-profits in our community totaling \$93,380. Round Up grants are made possible by the generosity of LPEA members who choose to round up their electric bill each month to the next highest dollar.

"We are so grateful to LPEA and the Round Up program for the support we've received at Animas High School," said Libby Cowles, Dean of Enrollment and Community Outreach at Animas High School. "The funding allowed us to outfit the MakerSpace and AudioLab in our brand-new campus at Fort Lewis College with state-of-the-art equipment so our students can build, create, and record beautiful, professional-quality work that demonstrates their learning."

A percentage of Round Up funds is also distributed to community



assistance programs each year. In 2022, the Round Up Foundation allocated \$25,804 to the Community Emergency Assistance Coalition and \$9,017 to the Pagosa Outreach Connection to help families and individuals with emergency assistance funds.

The average Round Up Foundation contribution is just \$6.00 annually. LPEA members can also elect to donate more each month if they would like to contribute additional money.

### 2023 LPEA DIRECTOR ELECTIONS



Are you interested in running for a seat on the LPEA board? In accordance with our bylaws, one third of LPEA's Board of Directors seats are up for election annually, and all eligible LPEA members are welcome to run. Directors are elected for three-year terms to serve the district in which they live.

### To be eligible, candidates must:

- Be a member of LPEA for at least one year immediately prior to becoming a director.
- Be a bona fide resident of the district you plan to represent for at least 120 days prior to becoming a director.
- 3. Not be employed by, or have a spouse or child employed by, LPEA.

### **2023 Election Timeline:**

- February 8, 2023: Board director candidate packets available online
- April 10, 2023: Completed candidate packets due back to LPEA
- May 3, 2023: Ballots mailed to all LPEA members
- June 7, 2023: Ballots due
- June 8, 2023: LPEA Annual Meeting and election announcement
- June 14, 2023: First board meeting for new directors

### 2023 scholarships include:

- LPEA Scholarship \$7,000/year for four years: 4-year scholarship to any U.S. college or university.
- LPEA Lineworker Scholarship \$12,000 total: 1-year scholarship to any accredited U.S. institution majoring in an electrical lineworker program.

- LPEA John Voelker Memorial Scholarship – \$5,000/year for two years: 2-year scholarship to any U.S. accredited vocational school, technical school, or community college.
- Tri-State Scholarship \$500 total: Scholarship to any U.S. college or university.

# Feeling Chily? HEAT YOUR SPACE SAFELY 1. Keep flammable items at least 3 feet away. 2. Place on a flat, level surface. 3. Make sure the cord is not frayed or cracked. 4. Plug it directly into an outlet. 5. Follow all instructions and use models endorsed by a reputable testing lab. 6. Do not use an extension cord or powers strip, which can overheat. 7. Do not use around small children or pets. 8. Do not use one with a damaged plug or prongs.
