EMPOWERING OUR FUTURE WORKFORCE



As we do every year, LPEA is offering scholarships for graduating high school students or equivalent (including GED graduates) in our service territory.

"This scholarship will give me the financial freedom I need to pursue a meaningful career," said Tim Hittle, 2022 LPEA John Voelker Memorial Scholarship recipient.

These scholarships aim to help students continue their education in academic and trade schools:

- LPEA Scholarships: Two, 4-year scholarships to any U.S. college or university (\$7,000/year for four years).
- LPEA John Voelker Memorial Scholarships: Two, 2-year scholarships to any U.S. accredited vocational school, technical school, or community college (\$5,000/year for two years).

- LPEA Lineworker Scholarships: Three, 1-year scholarships to any accredited U.S. institution majoring in an electrical line worker program (\$12,000 total).
- Tri-State Scholarship: One, \$500 scholarships to any U.S. college or university.
- Rocky Mountain Electrical League Scholarship: One, \$1,000-\$3,000 scholarship to any U.S. college or university.

PAY AS YOU SAVE WITH ON BILL FINANCING

Feeling drafty this winter? In partnership with First Southwest Bank (FSWB), LPEA can support your weatherization or heating system upgrade project through our On-Bill Financing (OBF) program. This program aims to help our members finance these projects over time while reaping the energy-saving benefits immediately.

The program covers labor and materials for projects such as caulking/ weather-stripping, insulation, LED lighting, storm or thermal windows and doors, insulating window coverings, water heaters, heat pump systems, or other heating or cooling systems that reduce energy consumption, and more. Distributed generation projects (i.e. solar panels) are also eligible for this program.

Apply for a low-interest loan to finance your energy efficiency projects with FSWB. If approved, you will then pay that loan off over time as part of your LPEA electric bill. That means no extra bill to and no extra hassle.

LPEA GRANTS

The Round Up Foundation Board of Directors approved **five grants totaling \$12,800 in November**. Approved Round Up Grants were for Aspire Medical Services for \$2,000, Early Childhood Council for Archuleta County for \$2,300, and Veteran's Park for \$2,500. Approved Education Grants were for HomeFund for \$3,000, and Liberty School for \$3,000.
