Log in to LPEA's SmartHub app 1. to report outages, manage your account, check your usage, and pay your bill anytime, anywhere. Call us at (970) 247-5786 or visit lpea.coop to get access.

- 2. Get outage alerts and updates on your phone by signing up for LPEA's Outage Texting Service. Text "TEXTLPEA" to 1 (888) 839-**5732** from the phone registered on your account. Register your phone on SmartHub or by calling us.
- 3. Bookmark LPEA's outage map, which provides up-to-the minute details on LPEA outages: outage.lpea.coop
- 4. Try these 5 five guick ways to weatherize your home and get the most out of your electricity:
 - Install door and window weatherproofing and door sweeps.
 - Seal any gaps and cracks with caulk and foam.
 - If your water heater is in a cold place, cover it with a specialized water heater blanket.
 - Insulate your attic door.
 - If you have older windows, install plastic window seals.
- 5. Prepare an emergency kit for your home.

EMERGENCY Supply Kit Checklist

- Non-perishable food and water for each member of your household for 3-5 days
- Wet wipes and hand sanitizer
- Back-up plugs and chargers for your electronic devices (solar, car, battery, or crank)
- Battery-operated radio
- Flashlights and lanterns with new batteries
- Carbon monoxide detector
 - Fire extinguisher
 - First-aid kit and prescription/ OTC medications

POWER TO GO: LPEA'S MOBILE SUBSTATION



Performing routine maintenance and necessary repairs on any of LPEA's 30 substations is made much easier thanks to one piece of equipment in LPEA's arsenal: our mobile substation. It allows our crews to de-energize critical electrical infrastructure without causing outages and is regularly used across LPEA's service territory to fix and replace aging equipment.

"Since we added the mobile substation to our list of equipment, we've been able to complete major upgrades that are badly needed on our system," said LPEA Substation Maintenance Foreman Ryan Peacock. "It's really a win-win. We get to do our job and make our system stronger and more reliable, and our members get to keep the lights on." The mobile substation is impressive. Measuring 45-feet long, it reduces voltage from 46 or 115 KV to 12.4 KV. In normal speak, that means it reduces the voltage of the electricity on our transmission lines to levels that are safe to power residential areas. It includes a trailer with a substation transformer, switchgear, breakers, emergency or station power supply, and enhanced cooling capabilities.

It requires eight skilled staff and three workdays to move and prepare. Once it's up and running, it absorbs the power load of the permanent substation so it can be de-energized to perform repairs and upgrades.

"It's completely self-contained and transportable," said Peacock. "This gives LPEA a dependable and selfsustaining power supply option in case of any event – planned or unplanned."
